What is an EPC?

An Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) is needed whenever a property is built, sold or rented. It contains

information about a property's energy use, typical energy costs and recommendations on how to reduce energy and save money.

An EPC is valid for 10 years and gives a property an energy efficiency rating from A (most efficient) to G (least efficient).
